

COVID-19 and Camp FGL



During your troops stay at Camp FGL we will be implementing several policies in order to minimize any risk.

- 1) Prior to departing for camp conduct a Pre-Event Health Screening Form for all participants.
- 2) Upon arrival at Camp FGL all Scouts and adult leaders will complete a second Pre-Event Health Screening with our camp medic.
- 3) Temperature checks will be conducted twice for all persons on property. Temperature logs will be posted in each campsite.
- 4) Handwashing stations will be provided at all program areas.
- 5) Sanitation supplies will be provided for each program area and all equipment sanitized after each use.
- 6) A limit of one group at a time for the pool. Each group/troop will have (1) one period of pool activity per day.
- 7) Dining hall will only be available in emergency situations.
- 8) Troops may have the option to sleep one person per tent. Troops may also bring a personal tent to use while at camp. If sharing a tent it is recommended to sleep facing in opposite directions.
- 9) No visitors or parents allowed on property unless it is an emergency.
- 10) Adult leaders that must leave the property for any reason must wear the appropriate PPE gear while off property.
- 11) PPE gear will be required when appropriate.
- 12) At all times maintain the appropriate social distancing guidelines that are recommended by the CDC and local Health Departments.
- 13) Troops may make reservations for any amount of days/nights they wish to stay.
- 14) A limit of 20 persons or less in a single space where all persons cannot maintain at least (6) feet of distance between themselves and any other person.

- 16) Any person that has a temperature above 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, fever, chills, muscle pain, sore throat or new loss of smell or taste while at camp must be separated from the group immediately and must leave camp property as soon as practical.
- 17) To the extent possible keep Scouts in the same group.
- 18) All adults present must over see handwashing before and after the use of each program area.
- 19) All adults present must enforce social distancing between Scouts at all times, and over see sanitation of campsites and community areas within their campsites twice daily.
- 20) Dining Hall, Administration, and Fort Bradshaw restrooms will be closed for use.
- 21) "Single Location" shall mean a space where all persons gathered cannot maintain at least (6) feet of distance between themselves and any other person.
- 22) Time limits for program areas and or equipment will be limited to one and a half hours (1.5 hours) for each troop.
- 23) Troops will follow all policies held within "The Guide to Safe Scouting"
- 24) Troops will be responsible for CDC approved sanitization and PPE gear for personal spaces such as campsites, tents, and vehicles.
- 25) No person shall be allowed on camp property if they have known contact with a person infected with COVID-19 within the previous fourteen (14) days or are exhibiting the following symptoms temperature above 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit, cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, fever, chills, muscle pain, sore throat or new loss of smell or taste.
